

Bronx Week Tour

Celebrate the Bronx! We will visit New Roots Community Farm on the historic Grand Concourse. In addition to food and honey production, the site features bioswales and a rain garden, landscape elements that capture and manage stormwater while providing native plant habitat. Next, we'll dine under the trees next to the casita at El Coqui Community Garden. Last but not least, visit the gardeners and chickens at Taqwa Community Farm. You will have the option to leave by walking the scenic, recently restored Highbridge back to Manhattan.

Bronx River Tour
