The New York Botanical Garden Offers Members A New Benefit: Children's Birthday Parties Featuring a Visit to the *Holiday Train Show*

On Sundays between November 23, 2008 and January 6, 2009, Members of The New York Botanical Garden can take advantage of an opportunity to celebrate their child's birthday in the Enid A. Haupt Conservatory, with a party in the GreenSchool and visit to the legendary *Holiday Train Show* in the exhibition galleries of the glittering glasshouse.

The party package includes a tour of the *Holiday Train Show*, pizza and beverages from Catania's Pizzeria and Café of "Little Italy" in the Bronx, all paper goods, a party coordinator, and an instructor from the Botanical Garden's Children's Education department who will conduct a fun gingerbread house activity with party guests. The "icing on the cake" for birthday parties booked this season is a visit to the *Holiday Train Show*, which features large-scale model trains traversing more than 140 replicas of New York landmarks—all created from plant parts such as berries, pine cones, leaves and seeds—and is one of the most eagerly anticipated family traditions of the season.

Birthday party slots are available 10 a.m.—12 p.m. on Sundays between November 23 and January 6. The basic package allows for ten children and ten accompanying adults to attend the party.
