
Experience the Magic of the Holiday Season at the Botanical Garden Schedule of Events for November 19, 2005 through January 8, 2006

Conservatory Exhibition

Holiday Train Show—Saturday, November 19 through Sunday, January 8

The *Holiday Train Show* in The New York Botanical Garden's Victorian-style Conservatory beckons visitors to enter a magical world brimming with history and enchantment. Experience the wonder of large-gauge model trains and trolleys wending their way through spectacular landscapes and past more than 100 replicas of New York landmarks, including the Brooklyn Bridge, the Plaza Hotel, Radio City Music Hall, and the Empire State Building—all created from plant materials such as bark, moss, twigs, berries, and pinecones by designer Paul Busse. New this year are the original 1923 Yankee Stadium and five historic Hudson Valley mansions, including Van Cortlandt Manor, Olana, and Kykuit (the Rockefeller estate).

Glasshouse Winter Flowers—Saturday, November 19 through Sunday, January 8

Stroll among lush, soaring palm trees to discover hundreds of brilliantly colorful rain forest anthuriums (flamingo flowers) and bromeliads with their vibrant flower-like bracts, thick leaves and deep water-catching vases. Brought together in the Conservatory's *Palms of the Americas Gallery*, these plants combine to create a tropical holiday sensation.

Library Exhibition

Flowers by Redouté, Artist for an Empire—through Sunday, January 22

This exhibition, located in the William D. Rondina and Giovanni Foroni LoFaro Gallery, encompasses the life and work of Pierre-Joseph Redouté (1759–1840), one of the most famous botanical illustrators. Redouté's light-filled compositions earned him the nickname "the Raphael of botanical illustration." His scientific illustrations and monumental works featuring French Empress Joséphine's plants at Château Malmaison are among the objects on view.
