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Holiday Train Show Celebrates 20th Year at The New York Botanical Garden

Annual Extravaganza Showcasing New York Landmark Replicas and Model Trains Extended by One Week

New Feature, The Artist's Studio, Offers Behind-the-Scenes Look at the Making of the Amazing Replicas Created from Plant Parts

Saturday, November 19, 2011 through Monday, January 16, 2012

The *Holiday Train Show*, the extraordinary exhibition of New York landmark replicas enlivened by model trains, is celebrating its 20th year at The New York Botanical Garden. Natural materials such as bark, twigs, stems, fruits, seeds, and pine cones, are used to create more than 140 scaled iconic buildings, including the Statue of Liberty, Brooklyn Bridge, Radio City Music Hall, and the original Yankee Stadium. A critically acclaimed and always eagerly anticipated tradition, the *Holiday Train Show* presents an enchanted New York, surrounded by the glow of twinkling lights in America's premier glasshouse, the Enid A. Haupt Conservatory.

More than a dozen large-scale model railway trains—from late-1800s American steam engines and streetcars to modern freight and high-speed passenger trains and trolleys—traverse nearly a quarter-mile of track across rustic bridges, along overhead trestles, through tunnels, and past waterfalls that cascade into flowing creeks. Thomas the Tank EngineTM returns to join the fleet of model trains this year.

The *Holiday Train Show* has been extended by one week through Monday, January 16, 2012, offering visitors more time to experience a truly unforgettable and engaging exhibition.

The Artist's Studio Offers Glimpse at the Making of the Exhibition

This year, for the first time, visitors to **The Artist's Studio** will get an insider's look at how the replicas are constructed. Models in different stages of completion will show how a structure destined for the *Holiday Train*

Show is framed and begins taking shape through the addition of plant parts.

The featured replica will be Kykuit, the landmark Rockefeller estate in the Hudson Valley, which is pictured here. Visitors to The Artist's Studio will see photos, interpretive panels, tools, and supplies that help tell the story of how show designer Paul Busse, his son, Brian Busse, and their team at Applied Imagination in Alexandria, Kentucky, create the magic that defines the *Holiday Train Show*.
