The Belmont neighborhood is home to a very diverse group of farmers and entrepreneurs, including La Familia Verde Coalition, a network of 5 community gardens, which operates a Tuesday farmer's market. First, we'll visit the Clinton Avenue Community Garden. Next, we'll have lunch in the Garden of Youth, a garden dedicated to providing agricultural learning opportunities for our children. Finally, we'll end at Garden of Happiness, one of the oldest community gardens in the Bronx (founded in 1988) for a tour of their longstanding casita, greenhouse, and chicken coop.
