Many native plants, including those attractive to pollinators, become overgrown and require division every two to three years to remain healthy (and create more plants for sharing!). Join Butterfly Project NYC (a project of the Bronx Green-Up of The New York Botanical Garden, City Parks Foundation, NYC Parks Green Thumb, and others) for a workshop on dividing mature perennials; participants will learn techniques and practice making and replanting divisions as well as take home any extra plants (based on availability).
