Bronx, NY—Spring is here and one of the best places to behold the glory of nature this time of year is at The New York Botanical Garden (NYBG). *Spectacular Spring Weekends* in April and May celebrate the breathtaking beauty of all the Botanical Garden's seasonal attractions in the outdoor gardens and living collections of its 250-acre landscape, a National Historic Landmark. Springtime highlights include a monthlong commemoration of Earth Day and an ample assortment of programming during themed weekends in our daffodil and lilac collections, for Mother's Day, and during Spring Uncorked—NYBG's annual pairing of wine and the beauty of spring. *Spectacular Spring Weekends* include tours, music, gardening and craft workshops, and other fun activities for all ages. Spring at NYBG is a time of abundant color and life, when trees return to leaf and thousands upon thousands of flowers burst into bloom as the weather warms. Daffodils, cherry blossoms, and magnolias display their peak blooms in April, and lilacs, crabapples, and azaleas are must-see horticultural spectacles in May. The Rock, Native Plant, and Perennial Gardens are not to be missed during a springtime visit to NYBG. Follow along with the bloom progression of some of the most

beloved spring collections and keep apprised of peak flower and color via the Botanical Garden's Bloom Trackers, informed by NYBG's horticultural experts.

April is also the final month to see *The Orchid Show: Natural Heritage* in the Enid A. Haupt Conservatory, showcasing the immersive and dynamic designs of landscape artist Lily Kwong.

As part of this year's Earth Day programming, NYBG hosts artist, professor, and fruit tree grower Sam Van Aken for a dynamic discussion about grafting—a centuries-old horticultural technique—and its integral role in improving local biodiversity and habitat conservation. Fascinated by the historical narratives and cultural significance embedded within fruit and their ability to preserve genetic diversity, Van Aken will share his citywide project, The Open Orchard, a public orchard on Governors Island that launched in 2022 and contains nearly 250 fruit tree varieties that once grew in and around New York City, but disappeared with the rise of industrialized agriculture. Van Aken will highlight the process of returning these lost varieties to sites throughout the city and its environmental benefits. He will also highlight additional projects, such as his partnership with NYC Parks GreenThumb, which distributes additional trees to local community gardens.

Sam Van Aken's famed conservation work, *Tree of 40 Fruit*, contains multiple varieties of apples, peaches, plums, apricots, and cherries that blossom and produce fruit sequentially. In this hands-on master class, explore the basics of grafting different varieties of apples,

and hear how old and new grafting technologies allow Van Aken to create public art that also serves as environmental preservation.

Earth Day Weekend Open House April 22 & 23, 2023; 11 a.m.-2 p.m.

Learn what work is done behind-the-scenes at The New York Botanical Garden and how NYBG's collections are cared for and how botanical research is conducted. The Open House includes hands-on activities and opportunities to learn from NYBG staff. Meet the Scientists who explore, understand, and conserve the Earth's vast botanical diversity and learn about their unique projects currently underway. Connect with the LuEsther T. Mertz Library Collections representing over a century of commitment to botanical and environmental research, then sign up for a Mertz Library Card or take home a coloring book featuring some of the Library's favorite illustrations from its rare books related to botany, landscape design, and horticulture. Participate in Herbarium Hoopla by visiting the William and Lynda Steere Herbarium, a National Systematics Research Resource Center containing approximately 7.8 million specimens, making it the second-largest herbarium in the world, and learn how these specimens are collected, preserved, mounted, and categorized with NYBG's Herbarium team. Admire their display of specimens, enjoy a mounting demonstration, and create a specimen to take home. On Saturday and Sunday, meet at the Arthur and Janet Ross Gallery for a **Steere Herbarium Tour**. On Saturday, stop by the Composting with Bronx Green-Up table at the Solar Pavilions near the Mosholu Entrance to discover the various ways food scraps can be turned into compost in New York City, learn about the Master Composter Certificate Course, check out composting worms, and pick up a reusable bag.
