Battery Park City Authority • 75 Battery Place
Battery Park City is turning dog waste into
compost! Learn about how Battery Park City
Authority is diverting dog waste from landfills to
create nutrient-rich compost that's applied back
to soils in a safe and environmentally
responsible way. This method minimizes the
amount of methane gas released into the
atmosphere and reduces the number of plastic
bags used to pick up pet waste. We'll also take
a tour of their indoor food waste composter and
compost tea brewing system.
