Complementary daytime programming on select dates during *Van Gogh’s Flowers* offer engaging, interactive experiences, such as “Plein Air Drop-In and Paint,” that spark NYBG visitors’

creativity, offer respite from City life, and inspire them to see nature as Van Gogh did.
