NYBG's Edible Academy and Everett Children's Adventure Garden offer daily activities in nature play, plant science, and gardening.


These facilities also allow for a deeper understanding of the natural world through seasonal programs for ages 2–13.

Designed especially for curious minds in Pre-K through elementary school, this hands-on garden is bursting with seasonal fun and botanical surprises.

Climb into the canopy on the Tree Top Walk, where little adventurers can see the garden from a bird's-eye view and spot leaves, branches, and maybe even a squirrel or two! Down below, winding trails lead to plant investigations, nature-inspired crafts, and playful outdoor activities that change with the seasons.

Every season is a new adventure at the Everett Children's Adventure Garden! Families can drop in for hands-on activities that celebrate the magic of plants and the changing natural world. From planting seeds and making nature-inspired art to exploring leafy trails and spotting seasonal blooms, there's always something exciting to discover.

With the help of our friendly Teen Explainers, young explorers dig into science, spark their creativity, and connect with nature through play. Whether it's springtime sprouts, summer pollinators, autumn leaves, or winter pinecones—there's a plant-powered experience waiting for everyone!

Each gardening season offers unique and engaging activities customized for children ages 3–12. Register for one or more seasons!

#### Sprouts Program (Ages 3-5)

Accompanied by a parent or guardian, children ages 3–5 experience nature up close while investigating living things, tasting new foods, and making crafts. In the winter, Sprouts explore the winter garden and our greenhouse, using both for seasonal activities. Spring through fall, Sprouts are introduced to the fun of planting and harvesting in the garden.

### Nature Camp (for Children Entering Pre-K4-Kindergarten in Fall 2026!)

Calling all curious Pre-K and Kindergarten adventurers! This summer, we're heading outside for sunshine-filled days of woodland walks, splashy sensory play, and nature crafts that spark wonder. From bug hunts to mud kitchens, our little explorers will discover science and the magic of nature through hands-on fun and creative play. All participants must be fully toilet-trained.

### Green Thumbs Gardening Camp (for Children Entering Grades 1–6 in Fall 2026)

Dig in to the summer season! Using the Edible Academy's greenhouse, classroom building, and gardens, campers will investigate plant growth and learn all about vegetables. Campers will use the NYBG grounds as an outdoor classroom to investigate themes of art and ecology. Children will engage in hands-on gardening, learn about sustainability, and participate in culinary and crafting activities.
